These items must be taken to waste services (Smugglers Way is the closest one) or organised with the council for collection online.

Please note that leaving items in the estate is considered fly tipping and we will always look to prosecute those who are caught in the act.

TEXT MESSAGING LOOK OUT FOR SERVICE STARTS SOON.

We will be using text messaging to inform you of any emergencies e.g. power cuts; to inform you of any social activities happening; remind you of any rent arrears; repair appointments and meetings. We look forward to hearing what you think about this service as we start using it.

NEW NOTICE BOARDS!

We are planning to install approximately 45 notice boards at every covered entrance to the blocks, and in key outdoor areas. This would give us maximum coverage of the estate and help everyone has can see any notices.

As we are a community, you will also be able to put notices up yourselves, however please note that we reserve the right to take down any notices that we feel is offensive or immoral.

HELP DESIGN OUR NOTICE BOARDS.

We are working with REMAKERY to make our own notice boards. You can help choose the covers of the notice boards and even make one yourself. Keep up to date with the notice board making days on the website www.deynsford.org or on Facebook and Twitter.
